



PRESS ACCREDITATION REGULATIONS

27TH WORLD MINING CONGRESS 2026 LIMA - PERÚ

1. INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS

All journalists submitting an accreditation request to the Peruvian Institute of Mining Engineers (IIMP, its Spanish acronym), as organizer of the World Mining Congress 2026, must provide truthful and verifiable information to validate their identity and professional status at the time of collecting their physical accreditation badge, including:

- A valid press ID issued by the media outlet (television, radio, print, online, specialized or mass media relevant to the industry, the event, and of national interest) where they are employed.
- A valid Tax Identification Number (TIN) demonstrating that the company is officially registered as a media outlet in its country.

2. NUMBER OF REPRESENTATIVES PER MEDIA OUTLET

- Accreditation requests must be submitted by each media outlet.
- A maximum of two (2) journalists per outlet will be accredited for print, radio, or digital media, and up to three (3) representatives per outlet for television media.
- Accreditation badges issued will be personal and non-transferable and may only be used by the individuals previously registered and approved.

3. COVERAGE COMMITMENT

- Accreditation is intended for journalists who will cover the World Mining Congress 2026 on behalf of news media organizations.
- Applicants must demonstrate that their primary professional activity is editorial journalism and not marketing, sales, or commercial content production.
- Accredited journalists commit to covering the event through interviews, live updates, reports, or other content related to the World Mining Congress.

4. PUBLICATION ACTIVITY REQUIREMENTS

- Television Media
 - ▲ The outlet must have maintained continuous broadcasting for at least six (6) months prior to the accreditation request.



- Radio Media
 - The outlet must have maintained continuous broadcasting for at least six (6) months prior to the accreditation request (during the year 2025).
- Print Media
 - The publication must have issued a minimum of four (4) editions under its authorship during the 2025–2026 period.
- Online Media (Digital Media)
Digital publications must meet the following conditions:
 - The online publication must have operated continuously for at least six (6) months prior to the accreditation request.
 - Social media profiles (Facebook, Instagram, X, or LinkedIn) will not be considered digital media outlets.
 - The outlet must belong to a company officially registered as a media organization in its country, with a verifiable postal address outside the website and a valid telephone number.
 - The online publication must regularly disseminate a substantial volume of original information, commentary, or analysis on national or international matters.

5. ACCREDITATION APPLICATION PERIOD

- Media outlets must submit their accreditation requests through the official website form (wmc2026.org) starting Monday, March 16, 2026. The deadline for submission is Friday, June 08, 2026. No applications will be accepted after this date.
- Applicants will be notified by email of the approval or denial of their request within fifteen (15) business days following submission.

6. ACCREDITATION PICK-UP

- The start date for badge distribution will be announced in due course. Accreditation badges may also be collected during the event dates, from June 24 to 26, at the Lima Convention Center, Calle del Comercio 192, San Borja, Lima, Peru.

7. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Accreditation will only be granted to journalists who submit the required documentation in advance and whose employment or representation of the stated media outlet is verified.
- The Peruvian Institute of Mining Engineers (IIMP, its Spanish acronym) reserves the right to request additional documented evidence to clearly establish the applicant's professional status and validate authenticity. Applications will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis, and all decisions made by IIMP are final.

- If additional information is required, applicants may be asked to provide: The two (2) most recent issues of their publication (for print media); Recordings of two (2) recent reports (for radio or television media); One (1) letter from an audiovisual media outlet confirming intent to broadcast the applicant's work (for independent television production companies); Original press clippings and photographs with the name of the publishing outlet (for photojournalists); Three (3) recently published articles signed with their name (for online media journalists).
- The Peruvian Institute of Mining Engineers (IIMP, its Spanish acronym) reserves the right to deny or revoke accreditation in cases where false information is provided or where activities are deemed contrary to the objectives of the World Mining Congress 2026.
